WHAT IS SCOPUS?

- Scopus is the largest Elsevier's abstract and citation database of research literature and quality web sources launched in 2004.
- It is designed to find the information scientists need - quick, easy and comprehensive.
- Scopus is the easiest way to get to relevant content fast.
- Quartile Q1 indicates that the journal is in the top 25% of its subject category; Q4 indicates it is in the bottom 25% of the journals in that category.

WHY USE SCOPUS?

- ▶ As a **researcher**, you can:
 - ▶ find out who is citing you - how many citations an article or an author has received.
 - ▶ see the main journals, disciplines and authors that publish in your area of interest.
 - ▶ check out the work and citations of other authors.
 - ▶ track research trends and make connections.

WHY USE SCOPUS?

- ▶ As an **editor**, you can:
 - ▶ find and evaluate referees and authors for review papers and thematic issues.
 - ▶ identify and contact potential editorial board members.
 - ▶ monitor journal trends
 - ▶ review the performance and coverage of new journals quickly.

GUIDELINES TO PUBLISH

- What is the best journal for my research?
- What related interdisciplinary, global research is being produced?
- Who is citing my work? Where is my work being cited?
- What is the trend - is this a growing or declining field?
- Who else is working on this in my country or elsewhere in the world?

The do and don'ts in maintaining the Scopus title

1. International representation in editorial board
2. Make use of prominent scholar to increase visibility
3. Consistency of publication
 - Total of articles published per issue
 - Date of publication
4. Citation – reduce self citation; cite previous publication to increase journal's citation

The do and don'ts in maintaining the Scopus title

5. Representation of articles from various countries
6. Stick to your scope of journal
7. Rejection/acceptance rate – implication on the quality of journal
8. Limit one author per year of publication – diversified the author
